Sparx Update

Since introducing Sparx for Mathematics homework in January 2023, MGSG students have completed 8845 hours of personalised learning and answered 503,435 questions correctly. In addition, 208 students have improved at their times tables. Sparx has also added new analyses for teachers each week so, from this term onwards, Achievement Points on EduLink will also be given to everyone in the class/set which has the highest completion rate each week and everyone in the class/set which has the biggest improvement each week from the previous week. In addition, any student reaching a new XP Level will also receive an Achievement Point, so make sure you use Sparx thoroughly for your examination revision. Sparx estimates that a student will reach a new level every term if they complete each week's Compulsory, Boost XP and Target homework and points earnt are carried on across into the next academic year. Keep up the good work.
